
School Community Council News


Feb. 10-14 is Staff Appreciation Week!

Pink Shirt Day is February 26th, 2020


We invite students and staff to wear pink on February 26th to show their support against bullying.



SCHOOL ACTIVITY FEE

If you have not paid your child's School Activity Fees please do so at the office.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

For the most part, we want our students to enjoy playing outdoors before school, during both recesses, and the noon hour. On rainy days, we allow students to come into the school upon their arrival and remain indoors during all breaks. In the winter, we use -30 degrees Celsius as our cut off to remain indoors. If the temperature and/or wind-chill in combination with the temperature exceed -30, then all students are permitted in the school in the morning and during break times. We do expect that all students be dressed appropriately for the weather, as there are many cold days that students are expected to be outdoors.

Students in Grades 3 through 6, who have signed permission forms for the Polar Bear Club, will have the choice to go outside – if dressed appropriately and if there is no extreme weather warning.










Our parking lots are out of bounds for students. We urge parents to support us in this safety endeavor by dropping off their children on the west side of the school on Olive Diefenbaker Drive; on Bradbury Drive, east of the Special Needs bus zone and between Gisi Road and Olive Diefenbaker Drive. We encourage the children to cross all streets in a safe manner by crossing at the corner or at cross walks. Teacher supervision is also provided at our major crosswalks. The Community Club rink parking lot is the bus pick up zone after school for our French Immersion busses, and a convenient place for French Immersion parents to meet their children for pick up.

We must respect the residents that border the school. Please refrain from turning around in driveways, as this is disruptive to the homeowners.

Board Meeting Highlights January 13, 2020

1. Communication Initiative

Happy New Year and welcome to a new initiative by the Board of Education to share a few of the highlights from each of its regular meetings held each month during the school year. The intent of this brief update is to inform schools, staff and the community, to promote communication and to encourage the community to connect with the Board and trustees.

2. Intensive Supports Accountability Report

The Board spent significant time learning about the status of the various aspects of the intensive supports work that occurs in the school division. The Accountability Report presented by Superintendent Michaud, and the discussion that ensued, provided a great opportunity for learning and planning. Did you know that the number of students with eIIPs has increased from 678 to 761 in the last two years? This is in addition to the 768 students requiring and receiving intensive supports who do not have a formal eIIP.

3. Annual SCC Gathering on February 4, 2020

The next two months are full of opportunities for engagement with the Board to discuss budget, strategic planning and learning environments for students. The Board will meet with the PAATA executive, the local Catholic school board and others and they are excited for the annual SCC gathering as well. The SCC gathering is earlier than usual so that the Board can connect with SCCs and SCCs can connect with each other and take actions within this school year.
