





Dear Administrator, Teachers, Parents and guardians

Due to the increase workload associated with cases of COVID in our communities and the start of COVID vaccinations, Public Health has not been able to complete the school aged vaccination programs for the past year. We are wanting to try a new initiative to ensure that as many children as possible are protected against vaccine preventable diseases.

On April 7th and April 8th, Public Health in Prince Albert will be hosting a mass school immunization clinic. We are encouraging students that are in grade 6, 7, 8 or 9 that did not receive their 2 set of vaccines in grade 6 or their 1 set in grade 8 (this year or last year) to attend. We will be having more clinics going forward, dates to be announced later.

Clinics on April 7th and 8th will run from 11am to 7pm at the Prince Albert Exhibition Centre (West Hall). We estimate that we will be able to accommodate about 300 students a day. It will be on a first come basis. If we have a line up when you arrive you will be given a time to return at. All COVID precautions will be in place. A health screen will be done at the door, you will be asked to wear a medical mask, touch surfaces are cleaned between each student etc.

We ask that only the student and one parent/guardian attend to limit the amount of people within the building. The student should come in a <u>short sleeve shirt</u> so the upper arm is accessible for immunizations. <u>Please bring the students health card.</u> Consent for immunizations will be obtained from the parent/guardian who attends with the student, no forms need to be completed prior.

Thank you for assisting our efforts to reduce vaccine preventable diseases in the school aged population and the community at large. Below are the vaccinations routinely given in these grades along with a link to the vaccine information sheets.

Grade 6 – Hepatitis B (2 doses), Human Papillomavirus -HPV (2 doses), Meningococcal ACWY, Varicella Grade 8 – Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap -combined in 1 needle) <u>https://www.saskatchewan.ca/residents/health/accessing-health-care-services/immunization-services#immunization-forms-and-fact-sheets</u>

SCHOOL ACTIVITY FEE

If you have not paid your child's School Activity Fees please do so at the office.

This fee is collected to assist in covering the costs of optional activities or events that would enhance the regular school programming and would enrich the education of participating students. Some examples of these are out of school educational experiences, activities, presentations and/or speakers. The fee is \$10.00 for Kindergarten and \$20.00 for Gr 1-8 & Dev Ed.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

For the most part, we want our students to enjoy playing outdoors before school, during both recesses, and the noon hour. On rainy days, we allow students to come into the school upon their arrival and remain indoors during all breaks. In the winter, we use -30 degrees Celsius as our cut off to remain indoors. If the temperature and/or wind-chill in combination with the temperature exceed -30, then all students are permitted in the school in the morning and during break times. We do expect that all students be dressed appropriately for the weather, as there are many cold days that students are expected to be outdoors.



PEDESTRIAN SAFETY



Our staff parking lots are a "no drop off zone" as they are out of bounds for students. We urge parents to support us in this safety endeavor by dropping off your children on the west side of the school on Olive Diefenbaker Drive; on Bradbury Drive, east of the Special Needs bus zone and between Gisi Road and Olive Diefenbaker Drive. We encourage the children to cross all streets in a safe manner by crossing at the corner or at cross walks. Teacher supervision is also provided at our major crosswalks. The Community Club rink parking lot is the bus pick up zone after school for our French Immersion busses, and a convenient place for French Immersion parents to meet their children for pick up.

We ask that you, please, respect the residents that border the school. Please refrain from turning around in or blocking neighboring driveways, as this is disruptive to the homeowners.

One other item of note, please remember that there have been changes made to the Traffic Bylaw which now prohibits U-turns in school zones. In an effort to improve the safety of our children, the City of Prince Albert has added this safety measure. There is a \$100 fine for violating this restriction.

Our Vickers' school zone is between Bradbury Drive and Olive Diefenbaker Drive.

Board Meeting Highlights March 10, 2021

At the March 8, 2021, Board Meeting, staff appreciation emerged in many conversations. Trustees frequently expressed gratitude for the amazing work of staff to provide excellence in education, despite the extra challenges from COVID. Other meeting highlights include:

1. SRPSD Board Meeting with Minister of Education

Trustees valued the opportunity to meet virtually with the Minister of Education, Dustin Duncan and capitalized on the opportunity to welcome him to his role and share some of the many successes in SRPSD. Minister Duncan expressed awareness and appreciation for the accomplishments of the division's staff in sustaining outstanding work in Early Years programming and bringing alive in schools inclusive learning practices. The enormity and nature of student need in the division surprised the Minister but he was thankful for the opportunity to learn and discuss potential solutions.

2. Trustee Learning & Development

SRPSD is laser-focused on learning and that is evident in the actions Trustees take at the Board table. Discussions and decisions about student learning are prevalent, but Trustees also ensure they are staying current with best practices in education and governance. At the recent meeting, the Board committed their time to participate in the upcoming national CAPSLE conference. The virtual conference will provide high quality low cost learning on dozens of educational topics from governance, to anti-racist education, to post-pandemic planning and many more. These sessions will support Trustees in their role as educational leaders and as effective voices in local government.

3. Division and Local Teachers Association Collaboration

Partnerships are a strong and essential part of SRPSD identity and despite COVID restrictions, the Board has sustained its many strong partnerships. Later this month the Board will meet with the leadership of the Prince Albert and Area Teachers Association PAATA for its regular engagement meeting. Agenda items are still being finalized but Trustees expect to provide the PAATA an update on the Board's meeting with the Minister and look for further conversation about the division's pandemic response. There is a strong and valuable tradition of open and amicable conversations about diverse topics often leading to productive response. The Board always appreciates the opportunity to collaborate with teachers on joint advocacy and action.
