

ICY CONDITIONS


Please be aware that icy conditions are present outside. For your safety, exercise caution when walking on the playground and walkways.



VICKERS MUSIC PROGRAM

March is a very busy month in the Vickers Music Department!

The Prince Albert Music Festival runs for 3 weeks and involves over 250 Vickers students in band, choir, general music, and instrumental solos and small ensembles - wow! There has been an



We will be running a practice recital during the day on **Tuesday, March 4th** in the Band room so all solo and small ensemble performers will get a chance to run their pieces for an audience before Festival. Please note that the Music Festival sessions are open to the general public, but due to copyright regulations, the Saskatchewan Music Festival Association does NOT allow any photos or videos



during performance. This also protects the privacy of our students, particularly in the large ensembles. If you would like to take a picture of your soloist after they are done playing you are welcome to do so. All soloists and small ensemble players are responsible for their own transportation to and from Messiah Lutheran Church on March 6th and/or 7th. The large ensembles (bands, choir, and Grade 4s playing northern spirit flutes) will be bussed to the venues on their respective days. Please note that French Immersion students are at Carnival at Carlton on March 7th, so if they also perform at Festival that day, transportation plans should be altered as needed between Messiah Lutheran Church and Carlton. If transportation for your soloist is an issue on any day, please contact Ms. Lohneis to see if alternate arrangements can be made.

The Grade 4s are currently scheduled to perform on Friday, March 7th but due to the French Immersion Carnival at Carlton we are in the process of seeing if that date can be switched to Thursday, March 6th (stay tuned to Edsby for more information).

The remaining bingo fundraising dates at Carnival Bingo for this year are March 23rd, April 11th, May 9th, and June 22nd. All bingos up to and including May 9th can be used towards this year's band and choir trips. The June 22nd bingo credit may be used for next year's trips or for a younger sibling. Any moneys not used on trips will remain with the Vickers Band Parents Association at the conclusion of the student's Grade 8 year and cannot follow them to high school. If you would like to work any of these bingo dates, please let Ms. Lohneis know. \$50 credit per worker per bingo will be applied to your child's band and/or choir trips.

Congratulations again to all students who have prepared for the Music Festival and are set to perform starting next week. You are representing the Vickers Music Department well and should be proud of your hard work.



PEDESTRIAN SAFETY


Our staff parking lots are a "no drop off zone" as they are out of bounds for students.



We urge parents to support us in this safety endeavor by dropping off your children on the west side of the school on Olive Diefenbaker Drive; on Bradbury Drive, east of the Special Needs bus zone and between Gisi Road and Olive Diefenbaker Drive.

We encourage the children to cross all streets in a safe manner by crossing at the corner or at cross walks. Teacher supervision is also provided at our major crosswalks.

The Community Club rink parking lot is the bus pick up zone after school for our parents to meet their children for pick up. Please refrain from turning around in the driveways, as this is disruptive to the homeowners.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

For the most part, we want our students to enjoy playing outdoors before school, during both recesses, and the noon hour. On rainy days, we allow students to come into the school upon their arrival and remain indoors during all breaks. In the winter, we use -30 degrees Celsius as our cut off to remain indoors. If the

temperature and/or wind-chill in combination with the temperature exceed -30, then all students are permitted in the school in the morning and during break times. We expect all students to dress appropriately for the weather, as there are many cool days when they will be outdoors.
