May 14-15: Choir - Moose Jaw


May 24-26: Grade 8 Band - Calgary June 9-10: Grade 7 Band - Regina

Wishing our incredible staff all the best in their new space—you will always be part of the Vickers family!






PEDESTRIAN SAFETY


Our staff parking lots are a "no drop off zone" as they are out of bounds for students.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

For the most part, we want our students to enjoy playing outdoors before school, during both recesses, and the noon hour. On rainy days, we allow students to come into the school upon their arrival and remain indoors during all breaks. In the winter, we use -30 degrees Celsius as our cut off to remain indoors. If the

temperature and/or wind-chill in combination with the temperature exceed -30, then all students are permitted in the school in the morning and during break times. We do expect that all students be dressed appropriately for the weather, as there are many cold days that students are expected to be outdoors.
