

### STUDENT PLACEMENT AT VICKERS

The process of placing students in classes for the upcoming school year is done with great care. Families often request teachers but as you can imagine, honoring all these requests would be impossible to balance classes. It is critical to ensure that each child is well-matched with a competent teacher and trust each class is balanced in terms of overall size, gender diversity, complex needs, and other factors.

We place great value on parent input about their child's personality, preferences, and learning needs. However, we do not accept or honor requests for specific teachers. In order to ensure that each class is appropriately balanced, we have made class placement a staff decision, based on extensive discussion of each student. We also strive to ensure that each child is placed in a class with at least a few friends, while placing specific friends is appealing for a variety of reasons, it is not always possible.

In August, you may see your child's class placement for 2025-26 on EDSBY, and we will not be making any changes to class lists after they are published on EDSBY, unless a change in enrollment or staffing makes it necessary to re-balance the classes.

It has been an incredible year in the Vickers Music Department!

Students travelled to Saskatoon to see the U of S Wind Ensemble in concert in both November and March, and spring band and choir trips have brought us to Camp Kinasao (Grade 5), Moose Jaw (Choir), and Calgary (Grade 8), with upcoming trips to Regina (Grade 7), and Saskatoon (Grade 6) happening in June.



The educational and social opportunities provided by these trips are invaluable and have included workshops, festivals, sectional clinics, rehearsals, concerts, and even a trip to tour the National Music Centre in Calgary and to see a live performance of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra featuring Ashley Brown - the original actress who played Mary Poppins on Broadway in NYC!

Vickers students had an incredible showing at the PA Music Festival this spring with entries from the choir, a Grade 4 northern spirit flute ensemble, 4 bands, 5 quartets, 1 trio, 7 duets, and 42 solos! Within our program we had 23 individual and ensemble scholarship award winners chosen by the adjudicators - wow! The hard work, dedication, and discipline required to prepare performances like these should be recognized and celebrated. You have all made our school proud and represented us like true professionals. Bravo! The choir was recommended to the SK Music Festival Association Provincial Finals level of competition where their recordings will be adjudicated and up for competition against other choirs from around the province, so we await those results in June.

The SRPSD ExtravaBANDza (massed band) concert took place in the CPAC at Carlton on May 28th and featured Gr. 5-8 band students from Vickers as well as several other schools in the city and surrounding rural areas all playing in one large band. What a fantastic way to bring our school division band community together and play with other musicians!

Instrument inventory will now begin as we move towards the end of the school year. **All instruments will be collected in June**, cleaned, repaired, and signed in for the summer. Students wishing to have an instrument over the summer can sign one out closer to the end of the school year once everything is back in order (see Ms. Lohneis for details).

Students wishing to participate in a **summer band camp** through the SK Band Association can see Ms. Lohneis for more information. These camps are a great way to further develop your skills on your instrument, keep playing through the summer months, and meet new friends!






#### Christina's Art School

We urge parents to support us in this safety endeavor by dropping


off your children on the west side of the school on Olive Diefenbaker Drive; on Bradbury Drive, east

#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

For the most part, we want our students to enjoy playing outdoors before school, during both recesses, and the noon hour. On rainy days, we allow students to come into the school upon their arrival and remain indoors during all breaks. In the winter, we use -30 degrees Celsius as our cut off to remain indoors. If the

temperature and/or wind-chill in combination with the temperature exceed -30, then all students are permitted in the school in the morning and during break times. We do expect that all students be dressed appropriately for the weather, as there are many cold days that students are expected to be outdoors.
